APPLICATION

- How have your typical Easter traditions and celebrations changed this year due to the current circumstances that surround our lives? What alternative ways have you found to celebrate instead?
- The innocent Jesus was beaten and flogged for our transgressions. He willingly took the sins of the world upon His shoulders. What sort of emotions are evoked in you when you read these Scriptures or when you hear Jeremy describe those moments?
- With His last breath, Jesus said, "It is finished." What do those three words mean to you?
 How have they changed your life?
- Even in the last moments before his death, Jesus prayed on behalf of his enemies. He pleaded, "Father forgive them, for they know not what they do!" He gave assurance and peace to the criminal on the cross who asked for His help, and He gave comfort to His mother. As followers of Jesus, how can we push our own circumstances aside like Jesus did and care for others around us?
